Membership News

The Dixie Chapter membership recently voted on changes that will affect all current and new members of the Dixie Chapter of the Buick Club of America.

- 1. Effective January 1, 2010 the standard Dues will go up from the old rate of \$12/year to the new rate of \$20/year.
- 2. Effective January 1, 2010 all previous Meritorious Award Winners that currently pay no dues will start paying 50% of the standard Dues.
- 3. Any new Meritorious Award Winner will get one year free dues and then start paying 50%.
- 4. Any new Member that joins during 2009 will have the option of paying up to three years at the current rate of \$12.

In addition to the 4 changes listed above, it was also decided that any existing member can pay for up to 3 additional years at the old rate of \$12 regardless of whether or not they have already paid for future years. Current Meritorious Award Winners that start paying 50% next year can also pay for up to 3 years now at the rate of \$6/year (50% of \$12) rather than \$10/year (50% 0f \$20).

This offer will be in effect ONLY until April 15th, so any Regular Member or Meritorious Award Winner that wants to take advantage of this limited time offer should send a check to Membership Chair Jerry Richstein now. Look in the current 2009 Roster to see what year you are paid through, or call Jerry at 770-924-4779.


Get Well Soon



This beautifully restored, National award winning 1930, Model-A Ford, is owned by Charlie, and Jeanene Adams of Cleveland, GA., and received the "Ford" award at the National AACA held in Philadelphia, PA in February, 2009, for the Best Restored Model-A. It certainly is a worthy stable-mate for their classy 1968, Buick Electra 225 Limited. Here are Charlie's comments about this award winner.

In 1957 I bought a 1930 Ford coupe and did what I thought was a complete restoration, in other words I wire brushed and painted the chassis using very few new parts and did a low budget job on the rest of the car. Jeanene and I drove it to the Model A Club national meet in Dearborn Michigan in 1959 sporting a pair of 1930 license plates. I sold this car a couple of years later, but I sort of missed my little coupe. Fast forward to 2003 when I bought a late 1931 Ford deluxe coupe from a fellow AACA member, Harlan Dahl. I was going to do a few repairs and drive it. Well, you know what happened. It turned into a full restoration. I finished it in time for the 2008 AACA national meet in Cleveland Tennessee where It was awarded a First Junior trophy and nominated for a national award. In February 2009 we received the Ford award given by the AACA for the best restoration of a Model A Ford. It was a far cry from my original coupe but maybe we will enjoy a few trips in it. It sure isn't as comfortable to ride in or drive as that big '68 Buick Electra 225 that we are now enjoying driving on tours. Charlie #25890

The Model T Ford is still used by more people than any other automobile. Eight million are in active service right now and many of them can be driven one, there and five years and even longer. two, three and five years and even longer.

Bring your car to us and let us look it over. You'll be surprised to see how little it costs to put it in tip-top shape.

New fenders, for instance, cost from \$3.50 to \$5.00 each, with a labor charge of \$1.00 to \$2.50. Tuning up the motor and replacing commutator case, brush and vibrator points costs only \$1.00, with a small charge for material. Brake shoes can be installed and emergency brakes equalized for a labor charge of only \$1.25. A labor charge of \$4.00 to \$5.00 will cover the overhauling of the front axle, rebushing

springs and spring perches, and straightening, aligning and adjusting wheels.

The labor charge for overhauling the average rear axle runs from \$5.75 to \$7.00. Grinding valves and cleaning carbon can be done for \$3.00 to \$4.00.

A set of four new pistons and rings cost only \$7.00. For a labor charge of \$20 to \$25.00 you can have your motor and transmission completely overhauled. Parts are extra.
