

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## The Adventure of a 1950 Buick Jetback Sedanet

Jack Horvath sent us an account of his and Pat's adventure on the After Tour following the 2008 BCA National in Flint, MI. Allstate owns the phrase "YOU ARE IN GOOD HANDS WITH ALLSTATE", but this points out that "YOU ARE IN GREAT HANDS WITH BUICK PEOPLE".

It was a dark and stormy night.

Well, actually, Pat and I were with the Buick Driving Enthusiasts on the After Tour from the 2008 BCA National Convention. This terrific tour had covered about 500 miles from Flint, and the tour was approaching John and Joyce Williams' home in Charleston, Illinois. John and Joyce were soon to be hosting the dandy final activity, the tour party. A few miles from their home, our venerable 1950, 4-door Jetback began a loud grating noise; it sounded as though the fan was hitting the radiator. After an immediate stop, we found that the noise was not the fan hitting the radiator, the noise was caused by the disintegrating pieces of the harmonic balancer hitting the radiator. Now, very few folks have any inside knowledge about a harmonic balan-

John kindly kept the Jetback for about 8 weeks while he ordered up a replacement harmonic balancer and did a great deal of important work on her. Pat and I were sad to leave our Jetback, but we were glad to be able to ride home to Atlanta with Bruce and Shar Kile and their grandson, Austin, in their beloved Buick, "Laverne".

Later, Bruce and I returned to Charleston with his pickup truck, the one with the Park Avenue logo on it, to drive the Jetback the some 600 miles down to Atlanta. Aha, hold on, not so fast there. After a midmorning departure from Charleston, we soon discovered that the Jetback's rings were shot. Without putting out a bit of smoke she was using 3 quarts of oil every 65 miles. We stopped at what seemed to be every auto supply store between Charleston and Atlanta buying up their 40-weight oil and Lucas motor honey and dumping it into our classic car. When I sighed and finally shut her down in our garage around midnight, it was time to uncross my cramped fingers and take some deep breaths.


