# \$5.00 Riviera Steering Wheel Repair By: John Link

I've been restoring my 1969 Riviera (with much help) and have finally gotten to my interior. The interior is in pretty good shape for a car with 100k but the steering wheel needed help. It seems that every '69 Buick that I've seen on the Internet either has a leather steering wheel cover over it or has been replaced by a non-stock steering wheel. The problem with the '69 steering wheel is the clear plastic (with chrome foil under it) that was used as a design element all the way around the wheel. The clear plastic deteriorates much faster than the black wheel leaving an ugly mess.

I want to keep my Riviera as close to stock as possible (on my budget) and the leather steering wheel cover wasn't an option. I tried a couple of fixes but ended up with a \$5.00 repair that worked for me. Yes, it's not an original NOS steering wheel but only you Buick guys will notice the difference.

<u>My fix:</u> First I carefully removed all the clear plastic & foil from the wheel, being sure not to damage the original groove. Then I purchased 5' of speaker wire from Home Depot (they had 2 sizes, the larger size fit in the steering wheel groove –cost under \$5.00), the speaker wire has a **See Steering Wheel, Page 2.**

clear plastic coating with a silver and gold wire. I then modified a tube of 3M Plastic & Emblem Adhesive so I had a syringe like nozzle to apply the adhesive to the groove (Super Glue is too runny and may harm the steering wheel) I started at the bottom of the steering wheel, placing a very small amount of adhesive in the groove, then pressing the wire in the groove, silver side up, securing with a small



C clamps.

The entire process took only a few minutes and now I have a steering wheel that looks good and feels correct while driving.

# **New From Buick**

There may be nothing worse for the enthusiast than returning from a trip to find rusty brake rotors peeking out from under fancy wheels after just a couple of days in the airport parking lot. General Motors has a solution, and has applied for patents for its Ferritic Nitro-Carburizing (FNC) process, first used on the 2008 Cadillac DTS.

FNC bakes the rotors at 560 degrees for 24 hours in a nitrogen-rich atmosphere, which applies a coating 10 microns thick, equal to one-tenth the thickness of a human hair. GM says this doubles rotor life from an average of 40,000 miles, to 80,000 miles and saves a customer up to \$400 over 10 years. Meanwhile, the iron brake rotors retain their steely color underneath those thin-spoked 20-inch wheels becoming increasingly common.

There will be no extra cost to consumers, GM says. The rotors are now used on the Buick LaCrosse and Regal,
