

Fun Facts About License Plates

Pennsylvania was the first state to issue vanity plates in 1931, consisting of just three or four letters. Early states with personalized plates doled them out on a reward system: A driver had to maintain a clean driving record for at least five years to be awarded the vanity plate. Certain four letter words still weren't allowed. Delaware still allows the use of porcelain plates, and companies still make them for collectors. On April 25, 1901, New York became the first state to mandate license plates on cars as a way to rein in the speeders and reckless drivers who were scaring horses. Two years later, Massachusetts became the first state to issue its license plates. In Wisconsin, the oldest surviving plate dates back to 1905, which reads "32-W": the 32nd plate ever issued in the state. Tennessee and Kansas fashioned plates in the shape of their respective states, though Wyoming and Colorado residents love to brag that every plate is shaped like their state. In Nunavut, Canada, and the Northwest Territories, the license plates are shaped like polar bears. But the province of Ontario beats that: You can buy a plate that reflects your love of "Star Trek" and your allegiance to the Federation. Arizona stamped a steer head on its plate, in reference to its beef industry, and it became the first state to give its plates some statewide sym-bolism. South Carolina followed with "The Iodine State". Naturally, Idaho referenced potatoes on its plates. Kansas settled for wheat. Florida and New Mexico both claimed "The Sunshine State," and the former won out. Ohio (where the Wright Brothers were born) and North Carolina (where the Wright Brothers first flew) both claimed the slogan "First in Flight." Ultimately, North Carolina won the right to use the phrase. Ohio had to settle for "Birthplace of Aviation," but it did end up with a consolation prize: a Superman-themed license plate
