BCA members from as far as Wisconsin & Texas were part of the 30 registrations in attendance at the **25th Anniversary South East Regional Meet** hosted by the **Dixie Chapter** in Madison, GA, October 8th-10th. The tradition of being the only "touring region" in the BCA provided the focal points for the fun filled three days of touring in beautiful central Georgia. The 26 Buicks on tour were divided into (2) groups & ranged in age from 1934 through 2011.

The first day was a short drive into historic downtown Madison where we (first) visited the Madison Cultural Center to become more informed about the history & traditions of the area & marvel at the architecture & construction of the 120+ year old brick school building which now serves as the home for the cultural center. Following lunch at the "Madison Drug Co. & Grill", the remainder of the day was "on your own". Several of us were content to simply "walk the streets of downtown Madison", browsing & shopping the many antique shops, while a few seized the opportunity to tour some of the (many) historic antebellum homes all within walking distance. It would probably be safe to say that about 90% of the participants did make a stop at "Scoops" for their daily ration of ice cream.

Friday was regarded as the "longest day" as we traveled approximately 140 miles roundtrip to Washington, GA. Although there were some patches of "morning fog", during the first 15-20 miles, the drive "over to" Washington was (as always) a pleasant one amid the changing fall colors & fertile

farm lands. Of course there were also the (very) interesting & educational comments being offered over the "airwaves" (CB radio) to enhance the rural drive. The first stop was at the Callaway Plantation, which is always a favorite, especially with history buffs & old car tours. From there it was just a short drive into downtown Washington where we were treated to a DELICIOUS lunch provided by the Washington Women's Club. (A meal provided by ladies' church groups or women's club, especially in "small town USA", is always far superior to restaurant meals & the Washington Women's Club certainly lived up to that reputation). 
