Ohio Chapter, Shar & I have been blessed with friends worldwide. We have visited more parts of this great country while traveling to (43) National Meets & participating in 20+ years of tours with the Buick Driving Enthusiasts Division than we probably would have ever visited if it weren't for our involvement in the BCA.

One thing is certain; the BCA is a family organization. When you joined the BCA you became a part of that family network. That's why we usually refer to our Buick National Meets as being like a big "family reunion".

While it is true that the Buick automobile is what brought us together to begin with, it's the people & the camaraderie that keeps us involved. Men & women of all ages & all walks of life are what comprise this great organization known as the Buick Club of America.

Oh sure, (for us) having access to parts resources, technical advice, plus free advertising in one of the finest automotive publications devoted to a single marquee is a definite reason to join, but having the opportunity to join a local chapter and/or a division provides even more friends plus additional access to parts & services for the restoration & maintenance of our Buicks.

To date 15 of our 56 memberships have replied either "yes" or "no". Now we are hoping that the other 35 memberships (60 people) are planning to attend the November 13th meeting to reply to the question in person, or maybe to get more details about hosting a National meet before replying "yes" or "no".

Actually the report from the national meet advisory committee & subsequent discussion should take a minimum amount of time at the upcoming chapter meeting, but there will be a follow-up committee meeting on Nov. 19th. **All those interested are encouraged to attend the committee meeting.** You may contact J.D. Westfall, Don McClair, Jerry Richstein or Bruce & Shar Kile regarding the time & location of that meeting. BTW, there will probably be a free lunch involved!

Oh, speaking of the November meeting, this might also be an excellent opportunity to begin "getting a little more involved". It's our bi-annual elections! Why not drop in & get a hint of what type of organization you are paying dues to? Just remember, business meetings are necessary in order to plan more "fun stuff". So please don't be concerned if all your restoration, parts resources or maintenance questions are not answered at that time. It usually takes at least 3 meetings & 1 summer picnic plus a couple of trips to a BCA National Meet to get all those questions answered.

To top it off, we also enjoyed a traditional Tennessee BBQ lunch with fantastic Banana pudding! Mr. Johnson's estate was once owned by country star Allan Jackson. Our Dixie Chapter folks were a part of the Southeast Regional Driving Meet taking in the sights around Franklin, TN, Oct 13 -15.

It was a joy to drive our Buicks through the lovely fall countryside of Tennessee. First up was the tour of the Nissan manufacturing plant in Smyrna. Next, we were completely amazed at the collection hall displaying over one hundred gorgeous autos, fifties juke box/soda bar/diner, and our luncheon barbeque, held at Willis Johnson's rural property. We visited several of the Civil War battlefield sites concerning the Battle of Franklin. Some 40,000 soldiers fought in savage close combat for six hours, leaving 7,500 southern casualties and 2,500 northern casualties. We saw Winstead Hill Headquarters on the southern side, Fort Granger Headquarters on the northern side, Carter house area with bullet holes still visible, and Carnton Plantation which became a southern hospital after the battle. It was here that the Carnton family set up a private cemetery for 1,400 southern soldiers. In between the visiting, our lunch meals were preplanned and always tasty in interesting locations.

Our Saturday evening supper was a lovely full dinner where everyone won raffle prizes, and a few important awards. One of our BCA folks came from 1,600 miles away in Arizona, and he won the Farthest Driver Award. Another driver had a breakdown, and he won the Hard Luck Award featuring a toy wrecker truck pulling a Buick. Our Dixie Chapter, with members **Bruce and Shar Kile**, **Bob Stone**, **Jerry and Jean Richstein**, **JD Westfall**, **Roy and Sharon Newby**.

Jack and Pat Horvath, Roddy Pierce, and James and Sarah Thomas being counted, won the award for the Most Chapter Participation. The tour was also attended by guests of **Bob Stone**; Luciana Swenson along with her parents Aldopho & Maria Swenson who were visiting from Brotas, Sao Paulo, Brazil.




