

# **Pitch Perfect**

# The Rejuvenation of Esmerelda Removing a Year's Worth of Pine Sap from an Estate Car Tom Lynde

As long as I can remember, my family has a strange quirk of naming cars after characters from the TV show Bewitched. For example, my 1989 Electra came to me from my mother named for character Samantha Stevens' grand mother, Grandmama. When I took delivery of my 1994 Park Avenue in November, it looked like an Esmerelda to me. Esmerelda had been garaged since new by her original owner, but when she became a part of the owner's estate she was parked outside under some pine trees for over a year. As pine trees do, they dropped loads of sticky pitch all over her fine finish. I love auto detailing, but this is the first time I had dealt with pine sap.

My first choice for removal was Bug and Tar Remover, which had little or no effect on the sap. Plain old fashioned soap, water and elbow grease were also non-starters. Goo-Gone and Goof-Off were equally ineffective, Taking my case to others. I had suggestions ranging from gasoline (not on your life!) to isopropyl alcohol. I was surprised that the alcohol was actually effective in removing the pine sap. Especially when poured onto a cloth and rubbed onto the finish. But fumes and flammability prompted me to seek an alternative.

The answer was on a shelf in my garage. Simple Green. I had already mixed it down with water to the recommendations on the label. I was amazed when the sap dissolved before my eyes when sprayed on the car. Like the alcohol, though, it seems to be more effective when applied to a soft towel and rubbed on the car. Non-toxic, mild odor, and gentle on the car's finished, the Simple Green seems to be the answer. I will be spending more time In the garage this weekend cleaning off the car. Hopefully she will be ready for her club debut soon.

#### THE GOLD MINE by Ken Green

The son of a Buick guy that is aging out of the hobby sent a note to our local club in Atlanta, stating the contents of a storage shed in which his dad had stored Buick parts was free to the first respondent. I responded. The storage unit hadn't been accessed in over 22 years and the contents were only generally known. Reportedly, there was mostly '38 Buick stuff, a little '40 stuff and possibly something from the 50's era Buicks. Our Buick man had owned a number of Buicks and was very active getting these things back on the road, attending shows and encouraging his kid's interests tagging along. His son, John Hoffman, now relocated to the west coast, was seeing to it that the parts in this storage unit were left in good hands.

The storage unit was located about an hour and a half from Atlanta where I live. In the past, I've been known to drive over eight hours for parts. This trove could be a real gold mine and it was close! I couldn't leave until later in the week and visions of NOS parts danced in my head like biscuit treats do for my dog. The entire drive was filled with anticipation; that really scarce part that I have not found would be there. I would become best friends with the '38 Buick guys for all those parts that I would uncover, sort of like the pork chop tied around the kids neck so the family dog would play with him. Who hangs out with '40 guys anyway, right? What a trip, what delight, what was there to see?

I arrived at the location and was met by Tony, the proprietor of the storage facility. He was a young enthusiast, and very much into antique special interest cars. He had a couple early Fords, model A's as I recall. Before opening the door, all the while getting jittery like I used to on Christmas eve, Tony and I talked cars and parts. It was a very en-joyable conversation, sharing the various cars we've owned in the past and one's that were currently in our respective garages. This was but one example, but you see young people are involved with this hobby and it was great to hear Tony's enthusiasm. We walked over to the storage unit door. I had pulled my truck with trailer to the front door. I had the engine hoist because there was an engine reported to be in there. I had plastic wrap to bind loose parts, cable ties, zip lock bag-gies, a couple empty boxes, blankets to cushion those perfect NOS '38 rear fenders, also reported to be in there, straps and drinking water so that I could rest after a couple hours of sorting parts. He opened the door.

When I was young, my family members would pan for gold, it was for fun and adventure. The gist of gold mining is that for every hundred tons of dirt you sift through, there could be an ounce of gold; could be. Behind the door was 22 years of dust, a very obvious mouse urine smell and a mound of dirt from a nonactive fire ant hill. I saw boxes so fragile to the touch that they fell apart when I moved them. Plastic bags containing loose parts disintegrated when pulled out of the boxes.

John's dad had the same affliction that many of the rest of us have. When salvaging from parts cars everything gets saved. When rebuilding an engine, the old pistons, scored from turning over in a frozen engine block are saved. Buckets of bolts and other hardware are saved. The second-best parts and rebuildable parts were saved. I found the gold mine!

After sorting through a hundred tons of dirt, I found my ounce of gold, not in all the NOS parts I had anticipated, but a couple hours of pure joy in my anticipation and a new car friend. Make that two car friends. John has a beautiful '48 Buick that his dad had restored with help from the former Lewis Jenkins up North Carolina way. We had lots to share about our dad's influence on our hobby. I think I would be welcome at Johns house if I drove out there to show him my car.


