Hello Dixie Chapter Buick Folks

You will recall that we were notified last month of the passing of our friend and long time BCA/Dixie Chapter member, Jack Horvath, a great American. In as much as the January issue of the "DVC" was already printed we were not able to offer a tribute to him at that time. Jack was retired Military, having served in the U.S. Army for 27 years with tours of duty in Germany and Vietnam in addition to various stateside and South Pacific military assignments. His principle "job" was that of transportation officer. His experiences are well documented in his self narrated You Tube audio book "Two Million Miles of Bad Road". Jack & Pat became BCA/Dixie Chapter members in 2006 with their "Burgundy Bomber", a 1950 Mod 46S & immediately became active members driving the Burgundy Bomber to shows and club functions. But it was probably joining our 6 car caravan to the BCA National/GM Anniversary in Flint in 2008 that, no doubt, became the catalyst for a near 14 year closer relationship.

Despite some major mechanical issues with "The Bomber" on the "After Tour" from Flint that resulted in leaving the car in Illinois under the watchful eyes and direction of new BCA friends, John and Joyce Williams, the car was repaired and the Horvath's subsequently joined the BDE, The Buick Driving Enthusiasts, to experience even more fun and friendship, as well as any technical assistance needed and more friends. Soon, like many active Buick loving new members, theyfound themselves adding another Buick to their stable, a beautiful 76 LeSabre Coupe. with A/C of course. Their involvement & activity increased in "all things Buick", especially the tours and outings of the Dixie Chapter & BDE.

In 2019 the Horvath's became the owners of "Big Red", a 1973 Riviera, which then became their show and tour car. It was rather obvious that Jack's favorite color was red. From the onset of their becoming BCA/Dixie chapter members, Jack was always willing to "get involved" and "do things". He once said, "I don't join and pay dues to an organization if I'm not going to be involved". He served as the club sales coordinator 2010-2014 and our chapter secretary 2017-18.



Hi Dixie Chapter Folk,

Last month I mentioned a 1973 Estate Wagon that entered my life and stated it was another story for another time. Well, now is another time, so here is the story.



My Dad's '69 Sportwagon was in need of replacement, so the search went out for a new car The local Buick and Pontiac dealership, Cannon Buick was a two block walk from my house, and I visited often. I fell in love with two gorgeous wagons. Both brand new 1976 models: A Buick Estate and a Pontiac Grand Safari, both dressed in metallic tan with Dynoc wood siding and tan interiors. Both were loaded to the gills and to my 15 year old self, either one was a perfect replacement for the '69.

Dad had another idea. A local judge turned his 1973 Estate Wagon in on the tan '76 Buick wagon. Dad brought home his trade. Yeah, I was disappointed but the '73 was a loaded two seat model with every option with the exception on the wood siding, Our first family car with air conditioning and power windows, and the clamshell tailgate was too cool. I warmed up to it. Good thing, because in another year or so I would be driving it.


And drive it I did. That 455 cubic inch V/8 had enough power to move that big wagon down the road in smart fashion. It was awesome to feel the frame twist under my feet with engine torque when laying a heavy right foot on the accelerator. I had a friend with a 1968 Lincoln Continental and we found ourselves in a clash of the titans on a couple of occasions on a lonely, straight stretch of two-lane. I honestly don't remember who walked away with the bragging rights from those meetings.

Mostly, the car was the epicenter of my social life. My friends rides included a Javelin, a 'Cuda, a GTO or two and several Mustangs, but my car was always the choice when we went out on a Friday night. Not that it was so cool, but because we could cram it full of people on our way to the bowling alley or Putt Putt course.

It was also about this time I started playing bass with local bands. The cargo space and that great clamshell rear door made it the perfect gear hauler. I remember loading my bass stack, two Fender Twins, a couple of synthesizers, a few guitars and a drum kit with no problem

With its power, space and imposing looks, it earned the nick name of "The Beast" It served me well during my senior year and shortly after graduation Dad traded it in on a little Pontiac Sunbird for my kid sister. I bought a 1979 Camaro coupe that carried me through college, while I was working as a musician in Boston, and ultimately my move to Georgia. While it did not have the space of the Estate wagon, one time when the band van broke down I did manage to get a couple of amps, a few guitars three band members and out 400 pound manager into it for an unbelievable ride home from a gig in a snow storm. To be young and foolish.

So the Estate Wagon was gone. Long live The Beast! I do not have a single photo of it to remember it by. I last drove it in June of 1979, expecting never to see it again. But as the fates would have it, we did cross paths again. It was in 1997 and I was living in Georgia, but visiting family in Massachusetts. Tammy and I were driving by the old hometown Buick dealership, when a familiar shape caught my eye. I swung my new Pontiac Bonneville into the parking lot and parked it next to a haggard looking dark blue Estate Wagon. The owner of the dealership recognized me, greeted me and said "yes, it is your old car!" He said that he tracked it down for another customer who wanted it restored to be used as a tow car for his GS drag car. So, it may still be out there somewhere. I truly hope so.






Weather permitting, be sure to drive those Buicks, There will be ample parking in "car show" fashion.
