Although the 50th BCA National Meet ended up with a total of only 247 Registrations (482 people), 160 cars, and 12 vendors the atmosphere was still "all Buick" everywhere. Like most "family reunions", seeing old friends and meeting new ones, a great time was had by all. For us Kile's the "big trip" began on Wednesday, July 5th. With Shar's 2014 Regal packed tightly with boxes of small parts for the (inside) swap meet nd sales items. There was barely enough room for some incidental things like a change of clothes (or 2), food snacks, bottled water, and a bag of road maps (because you can't always trust the GPS).

Never the less, our "one Buick caravan" headed northwest to attend our 48th consecutive BCA National Meet. After overnight stops in Sikeston, MO, Mound City, MO, Cheyenne, WY. & Pinedale, WY. We made our first (ever) visit to the Grand Tetons and Yellowstone National Park so crossed another item off our "bucket list".

"Then & Now" (Looking Back on 50 years of BCA Nationals)

Perhaps we should have titled this article, "Looking back on <u>48 years</u> of BCA Nationals, because that's how many we will have attended since joining the club in March 1973, assuming we make it here to Spokane. If you've been following the (well written) series of articles covering the history of BCA National meets in the Bugle, written by Brian DePouli, you have an idea of what it was like "back then". If you have not read these articles, we would most definitely encourage you to "catch up", beginning with the March 2023 issue and continuing through the most recent (July) issue.

For us personally, even though we missed 1971 & 72 because we weren't BCA members yet, we have enjoyed the "memory recalls" over these past 5 month's issues that have been skillfully condensed into individual paragraphs covering each year & augmented by some carefully selected photographs. Sometimes just the mere mention of a particular meet location brings a smile or even laughter, especially when we gather with fellow BCAers at these (Buick) "family reunions".

Yes, we can still remember highlights from each of those meets. Each & every National Meet seems to have a special uniqueness, sometimes because of the (geographical) location, such as the 1985 meet in L.A. (Universal City) with it's "movie industry influence" or the 1986 meet on the grounds of the "Indy motor speedway" & being able to drive our Buicks on the track, 1987 in Orlando, Fla. & the "parade of ducks" waddling on the red carpet into the hotel lobby at the same exact time each day. In 2009, we were in awe (each day) of the beautiful mountains of Colorado & our first ever "trip" up Pikes Peak. Sometimes the "uniqueness" of a National Meet comes from "firsts", as was the case in 1977, when (for the first time) the meet was held outside of "Buicktown" (Flint) & the first time the event was totally contained on the grounds of a hotel (in Strongsville, Ohio). 1984 was special to us personally because it was the first BCA Meet to be held south of the Mason-Dixon line (Atlanta) & the first (& only) time the cars were judged in two categories, trail-ered & driven.

Note: With the advent of the 400-point system (in 1989) the need for separate categories was no longer needed. That 1984 meet was also the "first" for offering

seminars in engine rebuilding, (specializing in straight 8's) & paint/body restoration. It also was the debut of this (old) guy as a meet co-chairman. The 1989 meet in Batavia was the inaugural ("first") for the 400 point judging system & the <u>first</u> time the swap meet circled the show field, a most convenient concept.

There is no question about it, we could "make a case" for any one of the 48 BCA National Meets we have attended as being our favorite or the best, including the (2) we hosted in Atlanta, 1984 & 1994, but the meets in Buicktown (Flint) will always hold a special place in our hearts. 


